

## COLLECTIVE NOUNS EXERCISE

A *collective* noun refers to a collection of things or concepts: for example, *collection* is a collective noun. English has a surprising number of collectives. Some refer to collections with a specific *number* of elements: for example, a *triple*. Some refer to collections of a specific *kind* of elements: for example, a *gaggle* of geese. Find collective nouns beginning with each letter of the alphabet, which do *not* imply a specific number of elements. For the letter *x*, you may select a noun beginning with *ex*.
